

NFIP Aims to Strengthen Urban Community Resilience

FEMA and its National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) are conducting outreach in four metro areas, including the Chicagoland area, to raise awareness of the risks posed by urban flooding and to promote the benefits of flood insurance. This outreach involves engaging local government agencies and community organizations to provide them with flood risk information and resources to share with their audiences, ensuring residents and businesses are informed and prepared. The initiative also targets cities including Detroit, Philadelphia, and Washington D.C. to highlight the increasing risk of flooding in urban and suburban communities. By focusing on these densely populated urban centers, the NFIP seeks to enhance resilience, provide resources and promote the benefits of flood insurance among residents and business owners.

In cities and suburbs, where day-to-day life presents an endless serie s of options — from deciding on the best route to avoid traffic to choosing between the countless dining spots that line the streets — protecting against the financial risk of flooding with flood insurance is a clear choice. Flooding is a significant threat to major metropolitan areas because cities often harbor unseen flood risks that can threaten homes and businesses in unexpected ways.

A single storm, shifting weather patterns, impermeable surfaces, small streams and inadequate drainage systems can all transform heavy rainfall into flash floods in a matter of minutes. Many cities are located near bodies of water that put them at risk for riverine, storm surge and other types of flooding. Climate change exacerbates these risks, making it imperative for cities and their residents to take proactive steps to mitigate the physical and financial impacts of flooding.

As residents of the Chicagoland area, the flood of options we face daily ranges from picking a baseball team to choosing where to get pizza. The things that make Chicago special, including its rich history and unique culture and cityscape, provide us with a broad array of options but may also increase the risk of flooding.

While Illinois' extensive system of rivers, lakes and streams enhances the state's natural beauty and supports tourism and economic development, it also poses significant flood risks. In 2023 alone, the Chicago metro area experienced two major disaster declarations — one in July and another in September — due to severe storms and flooding. These events caused extensive damage, particularly in Cook County, with more than 1,200 damage reports affecting homes and businesses, amplifying the importance of flood preparedness in our area.

For Chicagoland residents and business owners "flooded" with options, flood insurance is a clear choice. Flood insurance is more than just a policy — it provides peace of mind and security and is a crucial part of protecting the life you've built in the heart of the city.

ASFPM CFM Program is Going GREEN

Starting with the January 2025 CFM renewal cycle, ASFPM will no longer automatically send paper certificates at renewal. CFMs can easily download an electronic version of their certificate from the ASFPM Portal and can also purchase a paper certificate if desired. Newly-certified CFMs will still receive their first certificate in paper format, free of charge. IAFSM Annual Awards

Awards Season is approaching! Nominate Your Peers and Colleagues for Stormwater and Floodplain Management Awards, for recognition at our 2025 conference in March!

Do you know someone who has made notable contributions to furthering the goals and missions of IAFSM? Nominate them now! All nominations and references are to be submitted online or via email. Nominations are now being accepted for the awards listed below. Nominations for the following categories are due by February 3, 2025. Please visit <u>https://www.illinoisfloods.org/membership/awards</u> for more information.

- Floodplain Manager of the Year: Recognizes outstanding individual efforts and contributions at the local level in the area of floodplain management.
- Young Professional of the Year: Recognizes the achievements of IAFSM professionals and graduate students under the age of 35. It is recommended that nominations describe the nominee's service to the advancement of floodplain and stormwater management. This can include contributions to IAFSM and other professional organizations, technical contributions to the profession, and service to the community. Please include a letter of recommendation if desired.
- **Stormwater Management:** Awarded to an individual or group who have improved stormwater management or reduced urban flood risks through creative engineering, regulatory measures, or other approaches.
- **Mitigation:** Given to an individual or community that has encouraged flood hazard reduction through a buyout program, retrofitting, preparation of a mitigation plan, or other similar mitigation efforts.
- **Outstanding Service:** Awarded to an IAFSM Officer, a Federal, State, or Local Official, or a consultant who has gone above and beyond normal expectations and duties to promote or encourage IAFSM goals.
- Journalism or Public Outreach Award: Given to a media outlet that has produced floodplain or stormwater management special features during the year. The award can include individuals or agencies who have contributed to outreach and public awareness of floodplain or stormwater management issues.
- Legislation: Honors Illinois lawmakers or local officials for their efforts in floodplain issues. The award can also be given to an individual who makes extraordinary efforts to encourage the passage of legislation or to a community that has adopted unique local regulations that promote floodplain management or flood damage reduction.
- French and Mary Lu Wetmore Award for Lifetime Achievement: This award is the IAFSM's highest honor. It is reserved for outstanding longtime floodplain managers. These individual's long-term contributions have made a noticeable impact on floodplain and stormwater management efforts in the State of Illinois. This award is not always given on a yearly basis.


